# **Policy & Happenings**

- Farm Bill
  - Senate version released
  - Keeps SNAP work requirements as is rather than making them more strict
  - Keeps SNAP-Ed the same, more collaboration (see Sec. 4113 Nutrition Education State Plans)

#### Federal Update from ACPP Weekly Policy Update | Week of June 4, 2018

The House and Senate returned this week after their Memorial Day recess. They will be in session through the end of this month.

Senate Agriculture Chairman Pat Roberts (R-KS) has indicated that he may introduce a bipartisan Farm Bill as early as this week, with a markup in mid-June. While the dates may slip, he also has been clear that the bill will not propose any major changes to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), unlike the House counterpart.

The House may consider its bill as early as June 22, but the path forward is still unclear. Questions remain on whether there is a firm agreement among Republicans on how to proceed with competing immigration bills prior to the Farm Bill consideration and whether the Farm Bill itself needs to be amended to garner additional GOP votes.

#### Policies at Food Banks

- Desert Mission recently developed a nutrition policy for their food bank. Then, met with Arizona Association of Food Banks and Community Food Bank of Southern AZ.
- Are other LIAs doing similar work?
- Interest at food banks to increase healthy options or adopt nutrition policies?
- Interest/support for developing statewide policy?

Anne Costa- Strategy focused on increasing healthy foods in food banks.

Working with AAFB and CFBofSA

Discussing level of interest in bringing healthy food policies and nutrition

Theresa- Should we ask our local pantries?

Anne- Ask smaller pantries first if you can. What are they interest in seeing, what are the barriers?

Rebecca & Nancy- Old Town Mission food bank in Cottonwood, starting to offer more specialized food boxes for those interested in organic, whole foods. Available once a month that's advertised as healthier foods, still open to the general public.

Natalia- The CFB of Southern AZ is working with the UA to pilot healthy food boxes, focused on pre diabetes nutrition standards. I know nutrition standards are important to them but the implementation is the hard part. Is there a survey/question template that we can use when approaching pantry sites to ask about what they're doing? (Not yet)
